WHATS GOING ON?

Ever wonder what Presque Isle Audubon is accomplishing for birds? Lots! And here's the latest.

- We are sending two area educators on an all-expenses paid trip to Hog Island, off the coast of Maine, for "Sharing Nature: An Educator's Week". At this camp, the teachers will learn practical approaches and add inspiration to their environmental education classes. Taylor Hinton from Crawford Central School District, and Tina Fuhrman from Millcreek Township School District, will attend this July, and in September they'll share their experiences with us at a PIA program.
- DCNR has been working on a Bird Window Strike Prevention project at the Tom Ridge Environmental Center. PI Audubon provided the financial assistance for DCNR to purchase CollidEscape window dots. These dots will be installed on some of the TREC windows to reduce the number of bird strikes.
- In 2022 we provided the Erie County Library system with 6 birding backpacks. Each contained two sets of binoculars and two birding ID books, one for youngsters and one for adults. This year we were approached by the Erie & Crawford Library District to provide an additional 15 birding backpacks, one for each and every library branch in these two counties. Again, Kowa Optics donated 15 pairs and Vortex Optics gave us 50% off their usual price. The backpacks and binoculars have been delivered, and shortly the ID books will arrive, so hopefully each library branch will soon have the completed backpacks ready to lend out for the summer birding season.
- We sponsored the keynote speaker from our Festival of the Birds, David Lindo, to speak to a large group of elementary students at St. James school about urban birding.

SPRING FIELD TRIPS: WHERE BIRDERS FIND THEIR FLOCK



Presque Isle Audubon Spring field trips resumed in April of this year, drawing new and experienced birders from far and near. Even when the birds were not especially plentiful or cooperative, our participants had a great time just being on the park and enjoying the company of fellow birders. Janice Yeadon and three of her friends came up to Presque Isle from the Virginia area to do some birding and found our field trip schedule on the website. After the trip, Janice sent us this lovely email: "Michele-I just wanted to let you know how much my friends and I enjoyed going out with you and the other Audubon members last Saturday on Presque Isle. We appreciate how warm and welcoming your entire group was." They are also considering coming up next year to participate in the Festival of the Birds at Presque Isle.

Stephanie Kane, who's visiting Erie from Bloomington, IN joined us on the May 27th field trip to Dead Pond Trail. Stephanie is working on a research project as a Fulbright Scholar, involving the relationship between water and cities. She was grateful for advice on how to use binoculars and was excited and expressed a feeling of accomplishment when she was able to get on a bird on her own. She later wrote, "Thanks so much to you and Julie for today. I will always remember it as the start of a new path to wonder, and new friends."

Although getting towards the end of Spring Migration, we tallied over 50 species on May 27th. We have several highlights including nice views of a Mourning warbler, observing several Eastern kingbirds fly catching, and lovely views of a Nashville warbler. Perhaps the biggest highlight of the trip was that at least two birders got "life birds" which is a bird that the birder has never seen before. Our next birding field trip is scheduled for June 10th for a trek out to Gull Point. Our field trips are free, open to the public, and birders of all skill levels and ages are welcome.
